# **River Ythan SLA Report September/October/November 2022**

# 1. Introduction

The Don DFSB have been contracted to carry out fisheries protection, predator surveys, spawning surveys and habitat restoration activities across the river Ythan catchment throughout 2022/23 by the Ythan DSFB under a Service Level Agreement. Each activity is allocated a set number of mandays/patrols to accommodate the requirements of the annually agreed SLA. Activities are defined following consultation with the Ythan DSFB.

Any incidents relating to pollution and policing will be recorded and shared with the Clerk. Information from predator surveys well be collated and shared with the Clerk directly following the survey period. Information on spawning surveys will be collated and reported upon in a summary report following the end of the spawning period. Any seals reported above Logie Buchan Bridge will be reported to the Clerk as soon as possible.

All activities will be covered by the Don DSFB health and safety polices, as stated in the service level agreement.

## 2. Reporting

A log of all patrols and activities will be sent to the Clerk monthly.

From the 10<sup>th</sup> of the month up until the 18<sup>th</sup> fishing effort was good with many anglers seen. Small pockets of grilse were landed on some of the beats. Good sport was also had on the Machar pool, by ADAA anglers fishing for Finnock, which were showing in good numbers. From the 26<sup>th</sup> of the month the long awaited increase in river level occurred, bringing many anglers onto the river to enjoy the last few days of the angling season.

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## **Piscivorous Bird Counts**

Due to the severity of the high flows towards the end of November it was not possible to undertake the planned bird count safely. Water levels too some time to recede and bank conditions were unstable as a result of the flooding.
